

It can be one word or a group of words but not a complete sentence.↻ Introduction: The article may open dramatically with a question, quotation, some important anecdote or data to catch the reader's attention.↻ Body: Include all the major statements and their supporting ideas along with arguments, examples and evidence as required.↻ Conclusion: Conclude with a suggestion, hope, warning or a call for action.↻ Name of the writer: should be mentioned after the title. Remember points:• Generally descriptive or argumentative articles• Descriptive articles generally describe some person, place or thing.. In argumentative articles, we have to support or oppose ideas strongly.. All information should be provided logically and coherently. Repetition should be avoided. They bring monotony.• Good vocabulary, add quotes to the mix.• The word limit is 150 words, which must be strictly adhered to. The author's name must be given. Determination is required, if the article is argumentative. • The first paragraph expresses the view and other paragraphs support data, followed by a conclusion at the end.
